

Putting on the Ritz

Manhattan ad guru and hotelier **Dick Tarlow** has just bought a 5,000-square-foot, four-bedroom oceanfront penthouse residence in Puerto Rico's Ritz-Carlton Reserve Residences. The unit includes a rooftop pool and terraces.

It is the largest of 13 beachfront condos, priced between \$3 million and \$5 million. All have sold out during construction. The developers are now trying to sell the second phase of 14 additional units, plus 18 villas and townhouses.

The residences are part of a complex that will include the Ritz-Carlton Reserve hotel, which is slated to open in December, 2012.

The complex is the relaunch of Dorado Beach, Laurance Rockefeller's former estate and resort. During its glamorous heyday in the 1950s, Rockefeller's Dorado Beach was a favorite of Ava Gardner, the Kennedys and Joan Crawford.
